From Barbara . . .

What's important in your faith life? Is it how the church looks? Is it how we make offerings to the Lord? Our relationship with God matters most. Seeing the face of God in those around us helps us to personalize the loving nature of God. Our gathering as a community nurtures us to express God's love to all we meet. In this time of the liturgical year the readings emphasize that the end is near; are we ready to face what will happen at the end of time. Have we done what Jesus has asked us to do? Take time this week to be prepared for the end and the beginning of new things.

In the recent correspondence that's been shared in the bulletin from the Archbishop he is asking everyone across the Archdiocese to examine what we do, why we do it, and can we do it better. The first thing he has asked us to evaluate is our Mass schedule. The pastoral council will take a first look at our Mass attendance and schedule. Following their input we will be bringing the results of their discussion to the parish at large. Be prepared to seriously and critically look at what we are doing now and how we can improve. We don't know if changes will happen or not. But we also know change is a real possibility. About 12 years ago there was a popular book out titled "Who Moved My Cheese?" Its basic premise was change happens and those who are prepared for change are the most successful at adapting to the change. Change is a part of life and without change we die. I hope that everyone will look at how our parish communities can best serve God and the people of God. Change can bring about new life.
