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General Rules:

1. 4-H club members must have passed their 8th birthday but not have passed their 19th birthday by January 1 of the current year.
2. Exhibitors must be Adams County 4-H members, conducting a project in the field in which they wish to make entry, and be under the supervision of Pennsylvania State University Cooperative Extension Service by July 1 preceding the fair.
3. Students enrolled in an accepted vocational school curriculum must be conducting a project in the class in which they wish to make entry. Students enrolled in general home economics in a comprehensive high school are considered as qualifying. All entries shall be approved prior to the fair by a member of the Pennsylvania Department of Education, Agriculture or Home Economics staff, or their designated representative.
4. In any case where there is reference to 4-H and vocational classes, the South Mountain Fair Association has the option, if there is a sufficient number of available exhibits, to divide the show into two classes, a 4-H and a vocational, or they may be shown together.
5. 4-H or FFA member must be present and must have charge of his/her animal at the time of judging.
6. 4-H exhibits with project books will be accepted Saturday, August 18, 2012, 8:30 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.
7. **ALL exhibits, with the exception of animals which may be removed on Saturday after 10 p.m., will be released to exhibitors on Sunday, August 26, 2012 from 2:00-4:00 p.m. No prize money will be awarded for exhibits removed in violation of this rule.**

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Health Rules:

See General Livestock information.

Entry fee: \$3.00 per animal.

22. All animals must have an official ear tag.
23. No beef cattle showing clinical signs of contagious disease, including active ringworm, warts, lice and mange, will be admitted to any show.
24. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) **issued after May 1** is required. A current **rabies** vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older. The rabies information may be included on the CVI or a rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable. **Market cattle are exempt from the vaccination requirements.**
25. An Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the Fair.
26. Interstate animals exhibited at a Pennsylvania show or fair must meet Pennsylvania requirements, and must be accompanied by the Interstate Health Certificate to be eligible for entry.

General Rules:

1. When on exhibit in the ring, each animal must be under halter and under control.
2. When on exhibit in the ring, Junior exhibitors showing should have assistance available.
3. No breed exhibits are to be set up in barns. If interested in such an exhibit, consult with the department chairperson for alternative exhibit location.
4. No blocking chutes are permitted inside the beef barn.
5. All feeder calves must have been born between January 1 and February 28 of the current year.
6. Must be 100% dairy breed or a crossbred of dairy breeds.
7. Must be dehorned and castrated by 2 months of age.
8. Feeder calves must weigh from 450-650 pounds at weigh-in at the Fair. The ideal weight for finished steers is approximately 1,150 to 1,350 pounds. All finished steers must be finished at weigh-in at the Fair.
9. 4-H and FFA exhibitors are limited to exhibit one finished steer OR one dairy feeder calf.
10. **No breeding animal may be dual entered as a market animal for any species.**
11. **The Livestock Entry Form can be found at the back of this book or on the Premium Book page on the web site at www.southmountainfair.com and must be returned to the Department chairperson by August 1.**
