Health Rules:

See General Livestock information. Entry fee: \$4.00 per animal.

- 1. No sheep showing clinical signs of contagious, infectious or external parasitic disease, including foot rot and sore mouth, will be admitted to any show.
- 2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) **issued after May 1** is required. A current **rabies** vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older. The rabies information may be included on the CVI or a rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable. Market sheep are exempt from this vaccination requirement.
- 3. All sheep must be individually identified by an official USDA scrapie ear tag, tattoo, or an ISO-compliant RFID tag and this identification must be listed on the health certificate.
- 4. An accredited veterinarian shall examine the flock of origin, including sheep consigned to a show. The veterinarian must prepare the original health certificate, AAI-13, and must state on the health certificate that he examined the entire flock and found no evidence of contagious, infectious or external parasitic disease.
- 5. Certification by the owner and accredited veterinarian that the identified animal(s) is not known to have been exposed to scrapie.
- 6. An Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the Fair.
- 7. All sheep except whethers must bear an official USDA/APHIS eartag to be exhibited at the show. Sheep from flocks on the voluntary scrapic program must bear the official eartag, tattoo, or electronic ear implant.

General Rules:

- 1. Exhibitor must own all entries for at least 30 days prior to day of showing.
- 2. Any animal of unthrifty nature, unsuitable condition, or which cannot be satisfactorily handled under show conditions must be removed from the fair grounds.
- 3. A Pen of Lambs consists of two ram lambs and two ewe lambs.
- 4. A Flock consists of one ram, any age; two ewes, one year and under two years; and two ewes less than one year.
- 5. Breeder's Young Flock consists of one ram lamb and two ewe lambs, all born to and owned by exhibitor.
- 6. A Get of Sire consists of four breeding animals, any age or sex, the get of one sire. Get of Sire need not be owned by exhibitor.
- 7. Registration papers and health papers must accompany animals.
- 8. Space is limited. Entries will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis. In the event that space for all entries is not possible, each exhibitor will be limited to 6 head.
- 9. No equipment, feed, hay, bedding, etc. will be allowed to be stored in pens in the barns. These items must be kept in trailers.
- 10. No breeding animal may be dual entered as a market animal for any species.
