Health and General Rules:

See General Livestock information.

Entry fee: \$4.00 per animal.

1. Exhibitor must reside in Pennsylvania.
2. No goats showing clinical signs of contagious or infectious, or external parasitic disease will be admitted to any show.
3. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI), **issued after May 1**, is required.
4. Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID includes: a scrapie eartag, an ISO-compliant RFID tag, or a scrapie tattoo. Goats with an official scrapie tattoo must also have a unique individual animal ID (tattoo) to meet the scrapie ID requirements or goats having a breed registration tattoo and accompanied by a registration certificate are exempt from the scrapie ID requirement if the tattoo is legible and a registration certificate or a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection which lists the tattoo and registry accompanies the animal at all times since birth.
5. Testing requirements for Tuberculosis for out-of-state goats: All animals originating from states or zones designated “Modified Accredited Advanced” must be test negative within 60 days prior to importation. The negative test results must be included on the CVI or a copy of the original lab report is acceptable. All animals originating from states or zones designated “Modified Accredited” must originate from herds in which all animals 12 months of age or older have tested negative within 12 months prior to importation. Interstate animals exhibited at a Pennsylvania show or fair must meet Pennsylvania requirements, and must be accompanied by the Interstate Health Certificate to be eligible for entry.
6. An Animal Owner or Caretaker’s Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) form must accompany each animal and must be presented upon arrival at the Fair.
7. Space is limited. Entries will be accepted on a first-come first-serve basis. In the event that space for all entries is not possible, each exhibitor may be limited to 6 head. Health papers need to accompany animals.
8. No equipment, feed, hay, bedding, etc. will be allowed to be stored in pens in the barns. These items must be kept in trailers.
9. Judges reserve the right to rearrange the classes according to number of entries.
10. **No market animal may be dual entered as a breeding animal for any species.**
11. No more than two goats per exhibitor per class will be accepted.
12. **The Goat Entry Form can be found at the back of this book or on the Premium Book page on the web site at www.southmountainfair.com and must be returned to the Department 6 chairperson.**
